What is the KTRN meeting?

The Krabbe Translational Research Network (KTRN) meeting brings together a global network of cohorts to advance research in biology, chemistry, physics, and related therapeutic technologies for the purpose of advancing treatment for those diagnosed with Krabbe disease.

What is the Purpose of the KTRN?

To foster a robust exchange of ideas, discuss pre/post publication research and identify partnership opportunities to accelerate developments.

How many KTRN meetings have taken place?

A total of 8 KTRN meetings have been held in various areas of the United States. Dr. Maria Escolar, Professor of Pediatrics and Neurodevelopmental Disabilities at the University of Pittsburgh, was awarded a TLOAF grant to lead the KTRN efforts the following years: 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2018.

However, in 2019, The Legacy of Angels Foundation believed it was in the best interest of the Krabbe disease research community to lead the KTRN efforts utilizing the Gordon Conference Model. The April 2021 KTRN meeting will be the 2nd meeting held under the direction of TLOAF.

Please note: The KTRN meeting did not occur in 2011, 2017, and 2020.

I am doing research in Krabbe disease or a closely related disease that may help aid therapeutic advancements. Can I attend?

Yes, we would love to hear from you! The first step is to complete the KTRN abstract form found on our website by **Friday**, **January 15th**, **2021** and email it to stacypike@tloaf.org. The abstracts are used to select our platform speakers. If your abstract is not selected for a platform speaker position, you may be offered the opportunity to present your work during our poster session. The KTRN Steering Committee for TLOAF will notify you by **Monday**, **February 1st**, **2021** with one of the following responses: (1) you've been selected as a platform speaker; (2) you've been selected to present your work during our poster session; (3) your work at this time does not fit the needs of our meeting and we respectfully decline.

Yes! We encourage international researchers to submit an abstract form found on our website by **Monday, January 15th, 2021** and email it to stacypike@tloaf.org. We will notify you by Monday February 1st, **2021** if you've been selected to attend.

How much does it cost to attend?

At this time, TLOAF pays for airfare, hotel, and meals for the clinicians and researchers selected as a platform speaker or for the poster presenter.

Can I bring one of my staff members to attend?

If we do not approve your request, it's possible we will grant your staff member permission to attend but the costs will **not** be covered by TLOAF.
